The filing of the various reference documents that comprise the "Commercial Lines Manual" has necessitated a change in licensing and filing requirements with respect to Commercial Multiple Peril.

I.S.O and A.A.I.S. filed Division Nine - Multiple Line as a reference document (CL-78-RA-10 and AAIS - CAB/CP-1978-7-ML9 respectively). No longer are the rules and rates for the various lines of Insurance contained in these reference documents. Instead, you are instructed to refer to the rules and rates your Company has on file.

If your Company has adopted either of these reference documents, then in order to write the specific lines of insurance contained therein you must be licensed for the specific line(s) of insurance and have rules, rates and forms on file. The applicable lines of insurance are Boiler and Machinery, Burglary and Theft, Fire, Liability Other Than Automobile (General Liability), Inland Marine and Glass.

If your Company has adopted either of these reference documents and you are writing any of the lines of insurance enumerated above for which you are not licensed and/or do not have rules, rates and forms on file, you must notify this Bureau of same and advise us what action your Company is taking to rectify the situation. All other companies must acknowledge receipt of this Administrative Letter by completing and returning the acknowledgment form below.
